PENTECOST

Fifty Days after Jesus rose from the dead, as they were gathered in the Upper Room, the Holy Spirit descended upon Mary and the Apostles, fulfilling the promise he had made before he ascended to heaven. Today, fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and ask for the grace of a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit into our minds and hearts, into the Church and into the world. The richness of today's celebration is reflected in the options which are given in the readings and prayers of the Masses, which are different for the Vigil and the Masses during the day, which is similar to the other two great feasts of Easter and Christmas. For the past fifty days we have immersed ourselves in the Mystery of Easter and today marks another highlight of our Easter celebrations but also brings the season of Easter to a close. It also marks the conclusion of the period of "Mystagogia", during which those adults who were newly baptised at Easter have been reflecting on the sacraments they received and their incorporation into the life of the Church. After today we return to the "Ordinary Time" of the Church's liturgical year, which of course is not ordinary, because every day and especially every Sunday is filled with the mystery of the Resurrection and of Pentecost because the face of the earth has been renewed by God's Holy Spirit and each day is an occasion for living out our discipleship. Moreover, over the next few weeks a number of celebrations take place which provide us with the opportunity to explore aspects of our faith as disciples of Jesus, including the Most Holy Trinity, the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, and the Feast of St Peter and Paul.

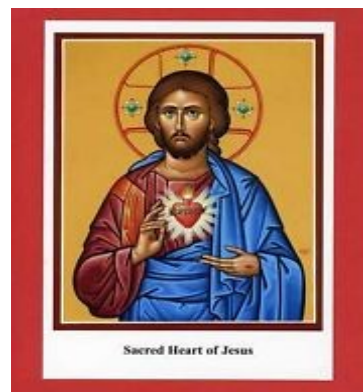
